

Who's Who

Lou Bynum a native of Peekskill, N.Y. received his B.S. degree from Ithaca College School of Music in 1963. He earned an M.A. from City College of N.Y. Lou is the Director of Music for Liberty Central School and director of the Liberty High School Chorus. He has given lecture demonstrations on the evolution of black music at C.C.N.Y. Lou did an outstanding job as musical director for the production of *Man of La Mancha* in 1971.

Jackie (Horner) Goldstein worked as a professional dancer on many popular T.V. shows such as Jackie Gleason and Milton Berle, and others too numerous to mention. Jackie taught dancing at Grossinger's for seven years. Professionally, she has choreographed ice skating and ballet routines. She has also choreographed shows such as Guys and Dolls, and Man of La Mancha. Jackie has also acted in many local shows. Her last acting performance was as Tina in The People Next Door for the Sullivan County Dramatic Workshop.

Gary Eckhart earned his B.S. in Art Education from Kutztown (Pennsylvania) State College, and his M.F.A. in Theatre Design from Yale University. During his seven years in Liberty Central School's Art Department he has staged, directed, coordinated and designed many of the P.T.A.'s past productions including *Peter Pan, Music Man, Sound of Music*, and *Camelot*. During the past four years, he has designed sets for many O.C.C.C. and S.C.C.C. productions. The magnificent production of *Man of La Mancha* was due largely to Gary's work as director, set designer, and costume designer.

Anita Katz starred as Aldonza in *Man of La Mancha*, the last P.T.A. production. She has also played in *Milk and Honey* at the Grossinger Playhouse for Hadassah and has sung professionally with the Robert Shaw Chorale. Anita is a teacher in the High School, teaching English and Humanities.

Anita Logan is not a newcomer to the stage, having been in many productions such as South Pacific, Sound of Music, Detective Story, and Man of La Mancha. She has been performing since the age of nine in school shows and on local television programs.

Robert Logan, Husband of Anita Logan, was bitten by the theatrical bug when he accompanied her to a reading for a play and found the casting director had given him a starring role in *Detective Story*. Since then, he has been in *Becket*, *A Majority of One*, *Man of La Mancha*, and *Feiffer's People*.

Barry Talkington, an English teacher in the High School, is originally from Clarksburg, West Virginia. He is the coach of the Debate Team in the High School and has seen his team to many victories. Summer stock on a showboat on the Mississippi is one of his many theatrical credits. Many of you will remember him as the Knight of the Mirrors and the dancing horse in *Man of La Mancha*.

Joanne Auborn, a teacher in the elementary school comes to us from Cleveland, New York. She was very active in high school musicals. Versatile and glamourous, JoAnn once played an old high-society lady in a high school production.

Wendy Kleinman is an eleventh grade student in the High School. She has been in plays since elementary school. Some of the shows she has done are Spoon River Anthology, Bessie, the Bandit's Beautiful Baby, and Oliver.

Laurie Beimler, has always been active in grade school plays and sings solos in school chorus and her church choir. She is a member of the county chorus and is an accomplished piano player.

Denise Bertholf, a ninth grade student and member of the school chorus, is making her theatrical debut with this production.

Reisa Gerber, an eleventh grader is an old hand at performing. She has played Gretel in Sound of Music and the White Rabbit in Alice In Wonderland. Some of her other credits are Spoon River Anthology, and winning first prize in the sixth grade talent show with Wendy Kleinman.

John Erts and Joe Symanski, two tenth grade students, have been working together as a team since seventh grade. The two boys developed an interest in theatre with their work in *Man of La Mancha*. During the school year they provide lighting and staging for the school concerts, drama club, and class plays. They also manage the stage operations for all touring groups coming to the school. They are presently working on an independent study in Theatre Arts.

Howard Barner, manages the automotive, metals and electricity classes in the High School. A graduate of Oswego State College, he has always been interested in singing. In addition to the special technical apparatus he helped design for the production, he is also assuming a minor role. He played a featured role in *Man of La Mancha*.

Gary Holmes, is a graduate of Liberty Central School, and is presently studying in the Theatre Department of Syracuse University. At Syracuse, he has produced, staged, directed and stage managed many productions. On the boards, he recently starred in the Syracuse University production of *Charlie Brown*, for which he received rave reviews.

Ed Levin, is a newcomer to Liberty, after serving for two years in the Peace Corps. Deeply involved in the sciences, theatre is a relatively new interest.
